ORDINANCE NO. JO-020-2021

A JOINT ORDINANCE OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY COUNCIL AND THE LAFAYETTE PARISH COUNCIL SUSPENDING UNTIL OCTOBER 1, 2021 THE ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS ASSOCIATED WITH THE REQUIREMENT THAT CLASS A-RESTAURANT CONDITIONAL PERMIT HOLDERS COMPLY WITH CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE I, SECTION 6-1 OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY-PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT CODE OF ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council, that:

WHEREAS, Chapter 6, Article II, Section 6-48(a) of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances requires Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders to submit quarterly sales reports; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 6, Article I, Section 6-1 establishes certain criteria relevant to a Class A- restaurant conditional permit holder including meeting the definition of a "Restaurant" as defined in that section, and the failure to meet that criteria subjects the permit holder to the penalties set forth in Sections 6-3, 6-4, and 6-5 of Article I of Chapter 6; and

WHEREAS, Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders have faced a series of extraordinary challenges beginning in 2020 and continuing during calendar year 2021 including multiple orders issued by the Governor related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the declaration of an emergency in February of 2021 as a result of a winter storm, and the cancellation of numerous events, festivals, and other gatherings due to the uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council find that as a result of the above listed factors, enforcement actions based on the requirement set out in Chapter 6, Article I, Section 6-1 defining "Restaurant", and in particular part (a) of that definition, would unfairly impact the Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders; and

WHEREAS, the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council find that Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders should continue to submit quarterly sales reports as set out in Chapter 6, Article II, Section 6-48(a) of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances so that Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government can review and analyze the reports to help determine the effect of the above listed events; and

WHEREAS, the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council find that a suspension of enforcement actions based on the failure of a Class A-restaurant conditional permit holder to meet the requirement in part (a) of the definition of a "Restaurant" in Section 6-1 is appropriate for a limited period of time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council, that:

SECTION 1: All of the above "Whereas" clauses are adopted as part of this joint ordinance.

SECTION 2: All enforcement actions against Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders for failure to meet the requirement in part (a) of the definition of a "Restaurant" found in Chapter 6, Article I, Section 6-1 are hereby suspended.

SECTION 3: This suspension shall become effective upon the effective date of this joint ordinance and shall remain in effect until October 1, 2021.

SECTION 4: Class A-restaurant conditional permit holders shall continue to submit quarterly sales reports as set out in Chapter 6, Article II, Section 6-48(a) of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 5: All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: After first having been adopted by a majority of the authorized membership of both the Lafayette Parish Council and the Lafayette City Council, this joint ordinance shall become effective upon signature of this joint ordinance by the Lafayette Mayor-President, the elapse of ten (10) days after receipt by the Lafayette Mayor-President without signature or veto, or upon override of a veto, whichever occurs first.
