

**CITY ORDINANCE NO. CO-078-2021**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY COUNCIL RECOGNIZING AND RATIFYING THE DECLARATION AND CERTIFICATION OF A PUBLIC EMERGENCY AS STATED IN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. CO-077-2021, WITH REGARD TO THE NEED FOR DRAINAGE MEASURES CAUSED BY THE CONTINUING RAIN AND STORM EVENT AND RESULTING FLOODING IN THE CITY OF LAFAYETTE, TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL CONTRACTS NECESSARY, INCIDENTAL, CONVENIENT, OR DESIRABLE TO ADDRESS THIS PUBLIC EMERGENCY, AND TO MAKE EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THIS PURPOSE BY AMENDING THE FY 20/21 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY-PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT BY INCREASING THE USE OF CITY GENERAL FUND PRIOR YEAR FUND BALANCE BY \$15,754,000 AND INCREASING THE USE OF CITY SALES TAX CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND PRIOR YEAR FUND BALANCE BY \$4,296.000 AND APPROPRIATING WITHIN THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT FOR EMERGENCY DRAINAGE MEASURES**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Lafayette City Council, that:

**WHEREAS**, as a result of a continuing rain and storm event affecting the State of Louisiana and resultant flooding, the Governor of Louisiana declared a State of Emergency for the State of Louisiana on May 17, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lafayette Mayor-President of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government declared a State of Emergency for Lafayette Parish effective at 8:30 P.M. on May 17, 2021 as a result of a continuing rain and storm event causing extensive flooding; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency drainage measures are necessary throughout the City of Lafayette to address the public emergency created by this rain and storm event and flooding; and

**WHEREAS**, considering the foregoing, the Lafayette City Council finds that the situation involving the need for these emergency drainage measures constitutes a public emergency affecting life, health, property and/or the public safety of the citizens of the City of Lafayette.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the Lafayette City Council, that:

**SECTION 1:** All of the aforescribed “Whereas” clauses are adopted as part of this ordinance.

**SECTION 2:** The declaration and certification of public emergency in Emergency Ordinance No. CO-077-2021 is hereby ratified and confirmed.

**SECTION 3:** The Lafayette City Council hereby certifies the existence of a public emergency affecting life, health, property, and/or public safety with regards to the need for immediate drainage measures caused by the rain and storm events and flooding described herein.

**SECTION 4:** In order to address the public emergency declared and certified hereinabove, the Lafayette City Council hereby authorizes the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government and the Lafayette Mayor-President to enter into any and all contracts necessary,

incidental, convenient, or desirable to provide for the drainage measures described herein, including, to the maximum extent permitted by Louisiana law, contracts exempt from the Louisiana Public Bid Law pursuant to La. R.S. 38:2212(P).

**SECTION 5:** The FY 20/21 operating and capital budget of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government is hereby amended by increasing the use of the City General Fund prior year fund balance by \$15,754,000 and increasing the use of City Sales Tax Capital Improvement Fund prior year fund balance by \$4,296,000 and appropriating within the Public Works Department for emergency drainage measures.

**SECTION 6:** This adjustment shall be as reflected in any pertinent documents which are attached hereto and made a part hereof and filed in the Office of the Lafayette Clerk of the Council.

**SECTION 7:** All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 8:** This ordinance shall become effective upon signature of the Lafayette Mayor-President, the elapse of ten (10) days after receipt by the Lafayette Mayor-President without signature or veto, or upon an override of a veto, whichever occurs first.





