

**ORDINANCE NO. JO-037-2022**

**A JOINT ORDINANCE OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY COUNCIL AND LAFAYETTE  
PARISH COUNCIL AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE LAFAYETTE  
CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATIVE TO THE  
ISSUANCE OF A BYOB PERMIT WITHIN THE CITY AND UNINCORPORATED  
PARISH OF LAFAYETTE**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council, that:

**WHEREAS**, to promote and protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the City of Lafayette and the unincorporated Parish of Lafayette while at the same time promoting and fostering business development in the City and Parish, the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council desire to amend Chapter 6 of the LCG Code of Ordinances to enact local rules and regulations relative to the issuance of a BYOB permit.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the Lafayette City Council and the Lafayette Parish Council, that:

**SECTION 1:** All of the aforescribed “Whereas” clauses are adopted as part of this ordinance.

**SECTION 2:** Chapter 6, Article I, Sec. 6-1 of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances is hereby amended in the following particularly only, with words in strikethrough being deletions from existing law, and words **underscored and boldfaced** being additions:

**Sec. 6-1. – Definitions**

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, whether they appear in lower case letters, italics or capital letters, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

...

*Premises* means the address for which the permit is issued, whether owned, rented, or leased by the permittee all buildings and structures thereon, and all land and property appurtenant, including parking lots, but excluding any publicly owned streets or sidewalks. **With regard to BYOB permits issued to persons operating vehicles wherein on-premises consumption of any alcoholic beverage occurs (e.g. Commercial Pedal Carriages, Party Busses/Trolleys, and the like), Premises shall mean the vehicle within which that activity occurs.**

...

**SECTION 3:** Chapter 6, Article II, Sec. 6-33 of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances is hereby amended in the following particulars only, with words in strikethrough being deletions from existing law, and words **underscored and boldfaced** being additions:

**Sec. 6-33. – Classes.**

(a) Classes for beverages of high and/or low alcoholic content. For the sale of beverages of high and/or low alcoholic content:

...

(g) ~~All permittees shall operate within the class for which their permit was issued. Failure to do so shall be a violation of this chapter.~~ **BYOB Permit. For persons who allow on-premises consumption of any alcoholic beverage at any premises open or available to the public.**

**(h) All permittees shall operate within the class for which their permit was issued. Failure to do so shall be a violation of this chapter.**

**SECTION 4:** Chapter 6, Article II, Sec. 6-35 of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances is hereby amended in the following particulars, with words in strikethrough being deletions from existing law, and words **underscored and boldfaced** being additions:

**Sec. 6-35. – Fees.**

...

(2) *Established.* The fees to be paid to the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government for permits required by the provisions of this chapter are as follows:

...

**i. BYOB Permit: \$575.00**

**SECTION 5:** All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 6:** After first having been adopted by a majority of the authorized membership of both the Lafayette Parish Council and the Lafayette City Council, this Joint Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature of the Lafayette Mayor-President, the lapse of ten (10) days after receipt by the Lafayette Mayor-President without signature or veto, or upon override of any veto, whichever occurs first.




