

CITY ORDINANCE NO. CO-055-2026

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY COUNCIL AMENDING THE FY 25/26 OPERATING BUDGET OF THE LAFAYETTE CITY-PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT BY INCREASING REVENUES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,200,000 IN MAYORS CHALLENGE FUNDS RECEIVED FROM BLOOMBERG PHILANTHROPIES AND TRANSFERRING \$582,049 IN NET LOSS-USE OF FUND BALANCE FROM FUND 1010, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING DEPARTMENT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Lafayette City Council, that:

WHEREAS, the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government has applied for a Mayors Challenge grant through Bloomberg Philanthropies for the repair of broken sewer lines and neighborhood improvements in vulnerable communities; and

WHEREAS, Bloomberg Philanthropies has made an award of \$1,200,000 to Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government for implementation of the project; and

WHEREAS, Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government has proposed a cost-share match in the amount of \$582,049 to further invest in vulnerable communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Lafayette City Council, that:

SECTION 1: The FY 25/26 operating budget of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government is hereby amended by allocating \$1,200,000 in Mayors Challenge funding from Bloomberg Philanthropies and appropriating within the Community Development and Planning Department for sewer repairs and neighborhood improvements in vulnerable communities.

SECTION 2: The FY 25/26 operating budget of the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government is hereby further amended by allocating \$582,049 of Net Loss-Use of Fund Balance from Fund 1010 as a cost-share match and appropriating within the Community Development and Planning Department for sewer repairs and neighborhood improvements in vulnerable communities.

SECTION 3: The Lafayette City Council hereby authorizes the Lafayette Mayor-President, or her designee, to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests, memoranda of understanding and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned projects.

SECTION 4: This increase in revenues and transfer of funds shall be as reflected in any pertinent documents which are attached hereto and made a part hereof and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Council. The Lafayette Mayor-President, or her designee, is hereby authorized

to amend the operating budget within the grant period by de-obligating any unused funds deemed unnecessary for the completion of the referenced projects.

SECTION 5: The Lafayette Mayor-President, or her designee, is hereby authorized to amend the operating budget within the grant period by transferring any unexpended appropriated balances into or out of salaries and benefits line items and all other expense line items in order to expend the total award amount in accordance with grant regulations.

SECTION 6: All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall become effective upon signature of the Lafayette Mayor-President, the elapse of ten (10) days after receipt by the Lafayette Mayor-President without signature or veto, or upon an override of a veto, whichever occurs first.

Congratulations on receiving a grant of up to \$1,200,000 from Bloomberg Philanthropies as a winner of the Bloomberg Philanthropies Mayor's Challenge (the "Initiative"), as described in Schedule A attached hereto. The City of Lafayette, Louisiana shall use the grant funds to implement its winning idea, to repair broken sewer lines in a vulnerable community at half the cost of new construction (the "Project"), as further described in Schedule B attached hereto.

By participating in this Initiative and accepting funding, you agree to the following:

Term

Grant funds will be available during the period beginning on April 1, 2026, and ending on March 31, 2028.

Payment

The first installment, in the amount of up to \$720,000, will be sent to you within 30 days of Bloomberg Philanthropies' receipt of the countersigned pdf copy of this letter and receipt by Bloomberg Philanthropies of a draft budget for the Project from the City. Subsequent installments will be scheduled for annual disbursements and are contingent upon your meeting the milestones and adherence to the requirements outlined below.

Milestones

- Hiring of a Project Director by June 1, 2026
- Completion and approval of Implementation Plan for the Project by July 1, 2026
- Completion and approval of final budget for the Project by July 1, 2026
- Completion and approval of Sustainability Plan for the Project by January 1, 2028

Requirements

- Complete the proposed Project as outlined in your proposal, with an implementation date no later than March 31, 2028.¹
- Participate in a periodic conference call or meeting with Bloomberg Philanthropies at least twice annually to provide Project updates and progress on Milestones.
- Notify Bloomberg Philanthropies in a timely manner of any key changes to project scope, timeline, final Project budget, or staffing, including to your mayoral administration and/or leadership of agencies or organizations on the project team.
- Request approval from Bloomberg Philanthropies before acknowledging our funding or crediting Bloomberg Philanthropies for support through the Initiative and keep any information of a proprietary or confidential nature owned by Bloomberg Philanthropies, including this letter, in strictest confidence and protect it from disclosure. Any press releases or other public materials must be shared with Bloomberg Philanthropies at least ten (10) working days in advance of publication for review and approval.
- Work with Bloomberg Philanthropies to maximize ongoing media opportunities, including but not limited to Mayoral events, press releases and social media promotions, participate in, and provide leadership with respect to, creating communities of interest in the Project, and work with Bloomberg Philanthropies and consultants provided by Bloomberg Philanthropies to document the Project by facilitating and/or producing publications, audio or video programming, film or other media regarding the Project.
- Cooperate with and provide information to the consultants provided by Bloomberg Philanthropies to serve as a learnings and technical assistance partner on the Project, including participating in monthly calls, periodic meetings and site visits, and providing information about the Project when requested.
- Secure additional funding, as necessary, to cover the full cost of implementation of the Project.
- Make all written work or other materials of any nature created in the course of or in preparation for the Project publicly available as Licensed Materials under the Modified Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike 4.0 International Public License, attached hereto as Schedule C, with the goal of fostering replication of the Project in other cities.
- Compliance with the other terms outlined in this letter including all applicable laws and regulations.

¹ For the avoidance of doubt, no grant funds may be used to provide any benefit to Michael R. Bloomberg, Bloomberg L.P., or any other disqualified person with respect to Bloomberg Philanthropies.
